

Through The Eyes Of The Principal

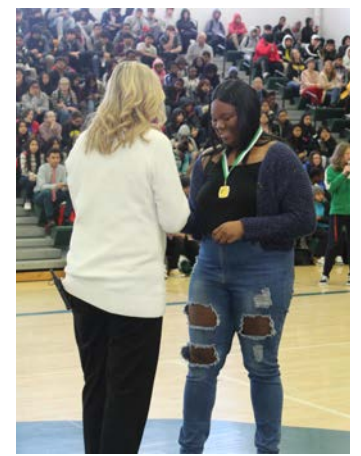
