"Someone taught me how to do it. They showed me the steps, and I got it."



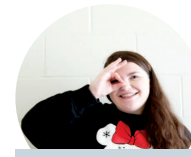
Isaiah Rich (11)

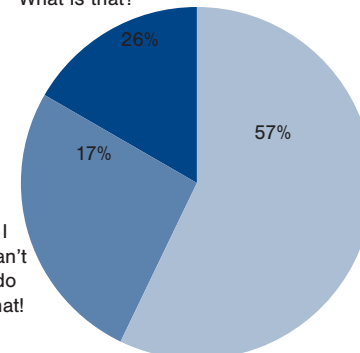
"I have been asked if I know how to do it. But I don't really know what the Finger Challenge is."
