

# UNTRADITIONAL PETS

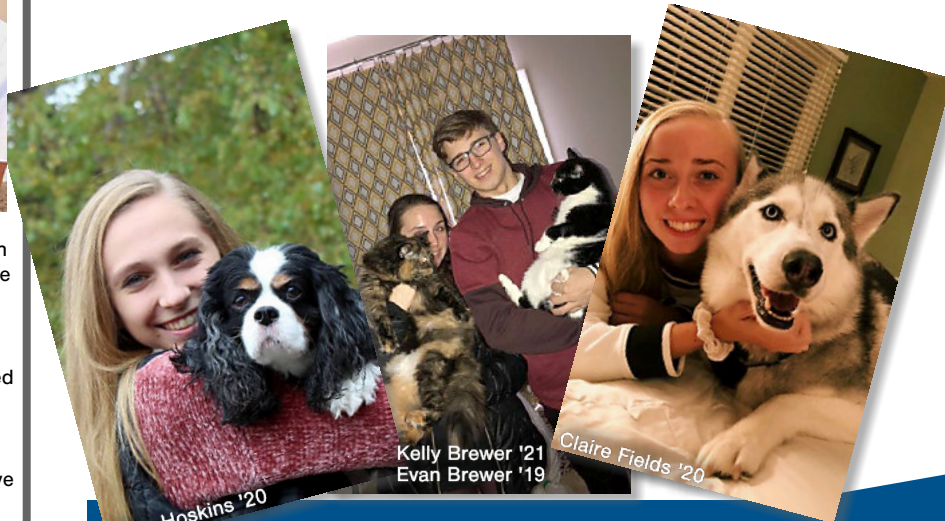
Pets come in all shapes and sizes. They may not be traditional, but they still bring endless laughter and love into Pleasant Valley students' lives.

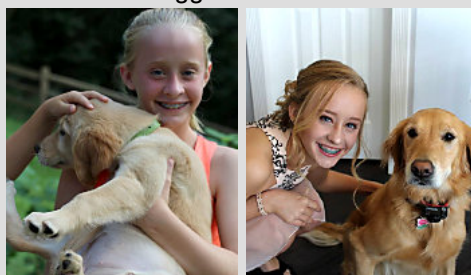

Erin Vincel '20 holds her siberian cats named Leo and Flynn. "They love to cuddle and they're the sweetest, most friendly cats anyone could ask for."



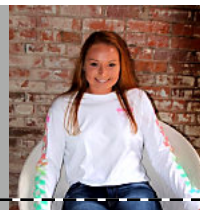

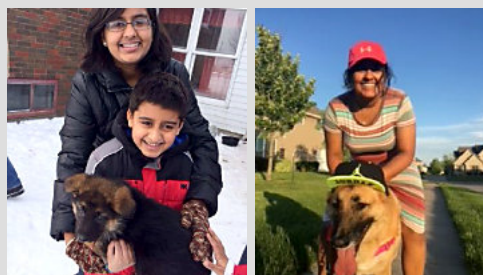

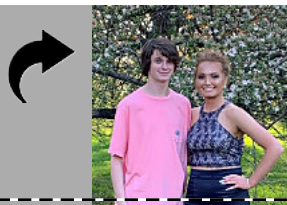
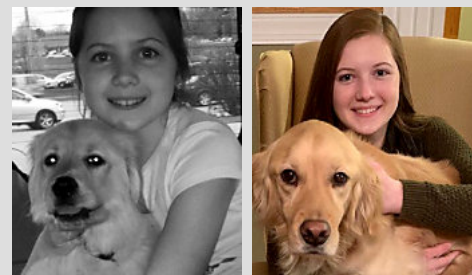
Claire Bebow '20 smiles with her English Springer Spaniel named Molly. "She's always welcomes any new people and loves to play in the snow!"
