INTERACT CLUB HELPS WITH THE MOVE PROJECT

A few of our local Indians started a non-profit project called The MOVE Project. By starting this project, Nick and Sam Mahistadt have been able to adopt two kids, build a school named after the project, and clean the wells in Ghana. The Indianola High School Interact Club has helped do fundralsers to raise money to help send a few students to school in Ghana.

The IHS Interact Club teamed up with The MOVE Project and the Mahistadt family for their international project. "Nick and Sam have been extremely flexible with us and letting us do our own forms of fundraising," Gaby Haynes, senior, said.

One of the fundraisers they did was a "Jeans Day" for teachers. The teachers and staff had the chance to donate \$5 to wear leans to school for the day, interact raised \$306, which is about 61 teachers! Paige Turner, freshman, said, "The Jeans Day was a very successful fundralser for our teachers and staff."

Another fundraiser that the Interact Club did for The MOVE Project was a "School Supply Drive." This fundraiser was available for middle schoolers and high schoolers to participate in. All of the school supplies that are collected will be sent over with Nick on his next trip to Ghana. Junior Payton Belt said, "We are doing this drive so we can sponsor a few students to go to school in Ghana. I costs \$30 a month to send a student, so we need to get a lot of supplies."

The final fundraiser interact is doing is a "T-shirt Drive. They will be selling "Be Kind" shirts to the community to make money to keep the wells in Ghana clean. All of the profits that are made during this fundralser will be used to clean the wells and to keep giving the town clean water. Haynes said, "It takes a village to keep everything running smooth and clean. We hope that our fundraising can help at least a little

With all of the money that interact is raising, they will be able to sponsor a student and help to clean the wells. All of the school supplies will be sent over to help further the students' education, which will take a huge burden off of parents knowing they will not have to pay for their child to get an education.

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


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
