Senior **Ben Graham** has had his own clothing brand for over a year. Graham said, "My brand is called '6 days' and I go for the street-wear look." He noticed that there wasn't an affordable clothing line that fit his style, so he made his own. Graham uses his peers around him for inspiration, "I get ideas from what people around me are wearing and what other companies are making but then I add my own taste to it." Senior **Alex Russell** also has his own clothing brand.

"During the summer, I started my own online business and it completely failed. Ever since I was a kid, I wanted to create a business of some sort. When the online one didn't work out, I just decided to do something more my style - a clothing brand." Instead of giving up, Russell took the experience and used it as motivation.
