"We had a lot of fun this season and got closer as a family. It might not have turned out the way we wanted it to in the end but we can't wait to be fighting for another opportunity next year."



"The most memorable moment of the season for me was when it was raining and we went outside to play. We all got to run and dive in the wet field and it was a lot of fun."






