This year's football season was one of highs and lows. After a rough start, the team rebounded with a dominating 24-7 victory over Pleasant Valley in its first district game. The Trojans went on to win three out of their next four games, including three straight victories over Davenport North, Muscatine and Iowa City High. Junior quarterback Marcus Morgan threw for 499 yards and three touchdowns over that three-game stretch. Junior Grahm Goering was phenomenal all season, but played especially well against City, where he had three total touchdowns. Will Hoeft '20 recorded 24 tackles over the final three games while fellow linebacker Grant Henderson '20 nabbed two interceptions, including a 98th yard pick six to seal the victory against Muscatine.
