## Golfing Goodbye Junior breaks school record in coach's last year

Getting into his Honda Fit at the Jester Park Golf Course, junior Jarred Rowser had one thought on his mind make it or

junior Jarred Bowser had one thought on his mind... make it on time to Rock Around the Clock and join his team in the homecoming week competition. He had just shot a respectable 69 shooting 36 on the first nine and 33 on the last nine holes.

What he did not realize was that he had just shot a school-record five birdies in a row, holes 11 through 15, in the meet with Ames. His coach Steve Smith told him several days later.

"I don't really know (what the old record was)," Smith said. "It's not like we keep 100% track of that. I just know that nobody has made five-in-a-row before."

Besides playing well, Smith considered him a leader. "He doesn't just lead, I mean he leads by example, not just words," Smith said. "His actions speak very loud for him. If we're working on something in particular, he's going to be doing that thing, and the other kids see that as an example of what to do."

The season was up and down for both Bowser and the team. "It was okay, we struggled at points I would say but overall I thought it was a pretty solid season," Bowser said. "We had some good showings here and there."

Bowser was selected Second Team All-State. "I was okay with it (making second-team all-state) and I wasn't," he said. "This is my second year making second-team all-state. I came in with the goal of making first team all-state, missed that by five spots, but that kinda killed but otherwise it was okay."

Senior James Hansen, a JV player, felt bad for the Black team (varsity) players that did not make state. "I feel bad for them just because they put in the dedication since their freshman year," Hansen said. "Jarred Bowser especially, he's very good at what he does, on the golf course."

The season was the last for Smith who decided to retire after 29 years at Johnston and 33 overall as a coach. The retirement came as a surprise for the team as they thought he would last for one more year.


"Throughout all the years he's been nothing but supportive of the entire team," Hansen said. "He's always flexible with everything I had going on with my life, so I just think he's a great guy. Great coach as well."

Senior Jacob Gault agreed. "He does a good combination of letting us decide what we need to work on based off of our game at the time and also still deciding what to work on to help all of us get better," he said.

Smith reminisced about years past. "I mean, I really enjoyed my time," he said. "I really loved being around the kids, and it's something I'm going to miss, but I'm still going to be involved with so I won't be going that far."




