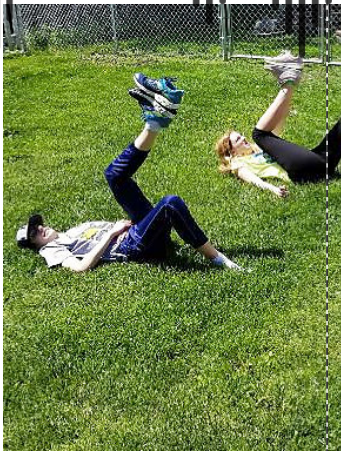
**Sack Races**

1st grader Jack Dewitt rolls toilet paper down his driveway toward plastic bottles.



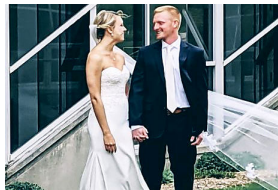
**Shoe Balance Challenge**

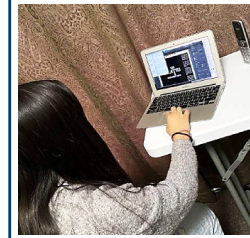
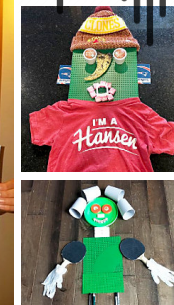
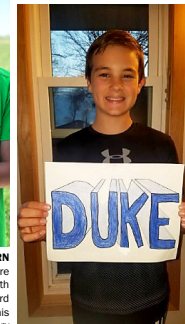


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**YEAR TO LEARN**
