Reducing the school week heavily decreases the total sum of school days. It turns 180 days into 144 days.

An increased weekend would mean an increased amount of time that the students may forget the topics they were taught.

Iowa BIG, which started in 2008, is an initiative-based school in Cedar Rapids. In Iowa BIG. students

We can't just be narrow focused.

- Block Scheduling allows time for students to ask teachers questions about tests, quizzes, and homework, etc.
- It is hard for teachers to engage students in school work and focusing on lessons.

In a Digital Learning Day school, once school has been canceled, teachers post that day's assignments onto an online

class course. From there, students will be able to access the assignments with the necessary materials and resources posted by teachers. Students

will submit their homework online. If internet access is an issue, students won't be expected to
