The President's Role

On The first Wednesday of 2021, Americans witnessed something they had never seen before. On January 6th, Trump supporters rioted at the United States Capitol building, fighting to prove that Trump was actually the winner of the 2020 election. The group stormed the building; they climbed onto the balcony, broke windows, and actually entered the building. They arrived in over-the-top Trump merchandise and thought that their presence would stop Congress from verifying the electoral college votes that would ensure Joe Biden as the rightful winner of the election. After hours of the mob trying to break into the building, the police finally had to disperse the crowd with tear gas and flash bangs in order to uphold the curfew instilled in Washington D.C.

A White House riot seems like something that is only discussed in history books and seems impossible in the modern day due to accessibility to a higher level of security and technology. There have been very few times that the White House has been raided by American citizens. In August of 1841 the Capital was stormed by protesters who didn't support President Tyler's decision to not reinstate the United States Bank. These protesters just rioted around the gates and did not attempt to come inside. In March of 1954 the capital was stormed by four Puerto Rican people trying to fight for the state ship of Puerto Rico. They shot from the outside injuring some congressmen before getting caught. These have been very few times when American citizens have actually raided or attempted to raid the White House/Capitol building which is why it is so crazy that it was able to happen in a modern day to this scale.

The actions on January 6th were unbelievable to most Americans because this really hasn't happened in their lifetime and certainly not to this scale. So why did these people riot? Most of the Black Lives Matter protests were peaceful with marching and chanting but some did break into more of a riot," Sean Finch, 12.

The way these rioters were treated at the capitol shows that there is still so much white privilege in the world. These white people defaced sacred national buildings and officers did not shoot at them. They got inside of the building and there were still no shots. In an ideal world no one would have to be shot at but if a black person or a person of any minority for that matter would have been sitting in the stealing documents, vandalizing capitol, property, and being violent towards police officers, they wouldn't have made it out alive. If George Floyd gets suffocated to death for using a counterfeit twenty dollar bill there is no way that a black man could deface national property and make it out alive If Breonna Taylor gets shot and killed for sleeping in her bed there is no way she could have passed the gates of the capitol building.
