Books come in handy during the school day even though they can add on a pound or two to backbacks. "I think that having an actual book will always be better than an online textbook," Emily Wilson '16 said.





A quick snooze during seventh hour helps Holly Paulsen '18 escape math homework. "Sometimes it is hard to stay awake from studying even though it is a necessity."




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
