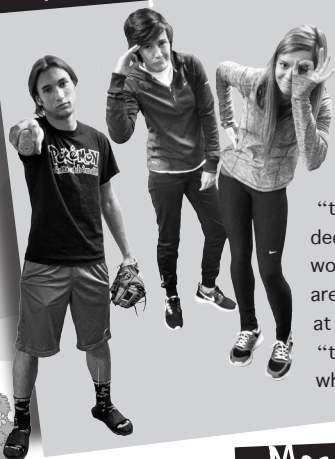


Most Likely to Go Pro in Sports

Most Likely to Cure a Disease



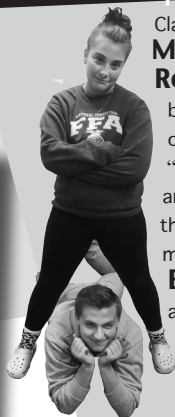
Fellow peers chose **Drew Haack and Hannah Lentfer** because "they are super smart and caring" and "they [seem like they] can change the world."

Most Likely to Become a Comedian



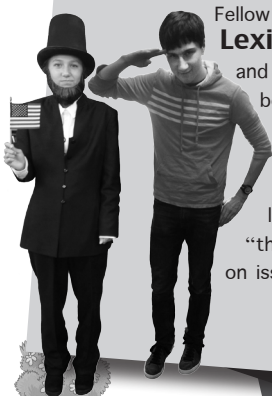
