At Hurts, you are guaranteed to find something made just for you. They offer 70 different kinds of

doughnuts and even doughnut milkshakes. Right away I was in awe at the plethora of doughnut choices, and the names of these doughnuts only added to the excitement.

Their "Maple Bacon Me Crazy" is a long john coated in maple frosting and packed with bacon bits. Hurts goes beyond the classic glazed and sprinkled, using the most unlikely doughnut flavors like peanut butter and jelly, and Nutella. They also used crowd favorite cereals to create their popular lineup called "Cereal Killers".
