Alex Vaughn '18 works on a metalworking project in Room 155 during 6th hour. "I enjoy making things," he said.

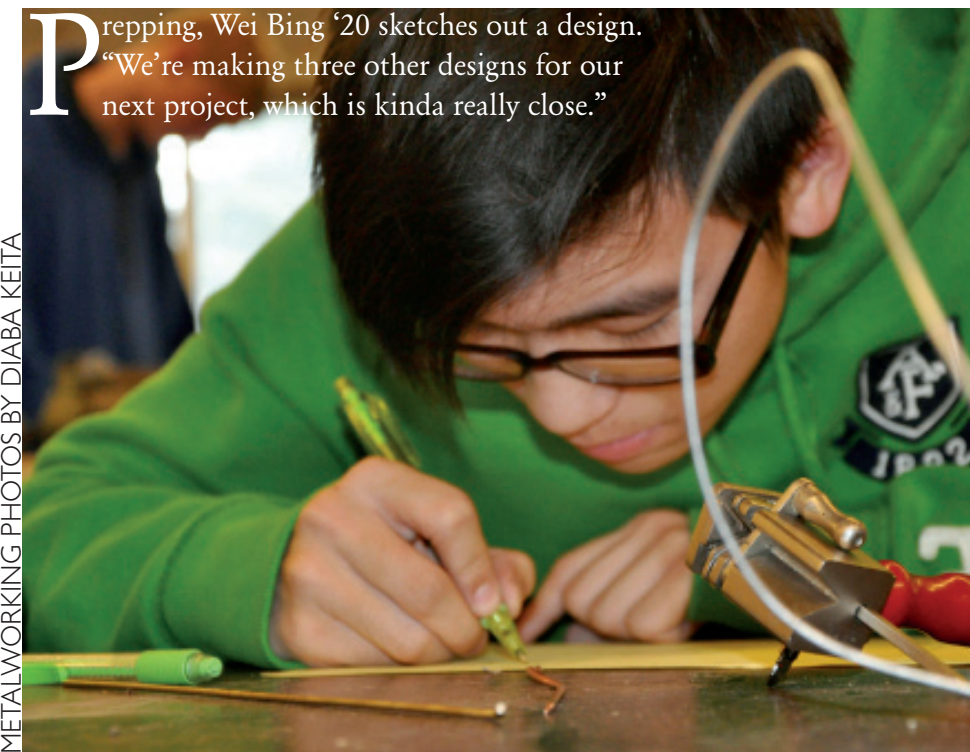


**SHINE IT UP**

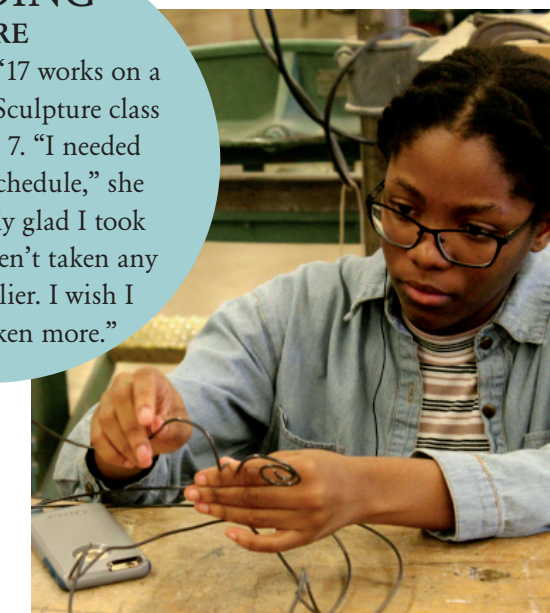
**SCRAPE
