In 2010, Charity Nebbe became the host of the daily interview program on Iowa Public Radio "Talk of Iowa". It was a homecoming for her as she moved back to her native state. She began her career in public radio at WOI Radio in Ames, Iowa when she was a student at Iowa State University and has been working in public radio ever since. Previously she created the nationally syndicated public radio show "Chinwag Theater". Nebbe produced and co-hosted the show with well-known author Daniel Pinkwater. Additionally, Nebbe spent ten years as a host and producer at Michigan Radio in Ann Arbor, Michigan.

In addition to her award winning radio work, Nebbe hosts the Emmy Award winning show "Iowa Ingredient" on Iowa PBS. She also is the author of the children's book "Our Walk in the Woods" which was published in 2008.
