**Hardesty** splits his day half work/half school. He is finishing the second semester with two online classes, so he is able to work the part-time shift from 6-11:45 a.m.



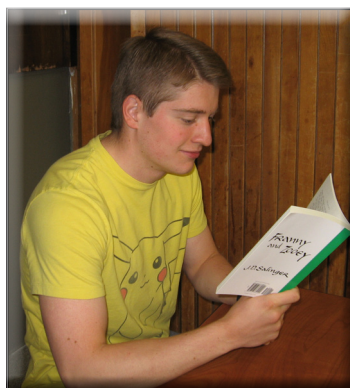
He is appreciative of the experience he gained from **Sheila Graham's** welding class, a new course offered to students this year.

## Someone 2 Know

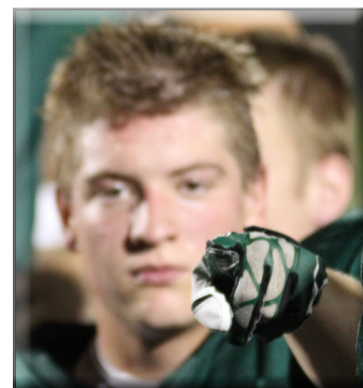
### Senior Alex Moore
