The euphoria of escaping school courtesy of Old Man Winter diminished as 2-hour delays began to feel like an average week. If it wasn't a delay, it was a snow day. Or vice versa. Arctic blasts stormed the nation, plummeting temperatures to negative double digits. Teachers and underclassmen dreaded making up snow days in June, but smug seniors celebrated their locked-in May 22 graduation.

The district faced controversy when it held school on Jan. 20, Martin Luther King Jr. Day. A drop in attendance combined with parental backlash prompted the district to give students and staff that day off in 2015.

Participants in the Mini Dance Marathon danced and mingled with families of cancer patients for five hours Jan. 19, raising \$56,100. Students and staff lined up to cut their hair or shave their heads in support of the cause.

The boys swim team also pulled out electric razors and buzzed off their bleached hair in preparation for Districts on Feb. 8. Then they started what they hoped would be a tradition, winning State for the first time in school history.

It wasn't swimming but skiing, skating and skeleton that captured the world's attention at the 22nd Winter Olympics in Sochi, Russia. Controversy threatened to disrupt the games as Russia appeared unprepared, but that didn't stop the U.S. from bringing home 25 medals.
